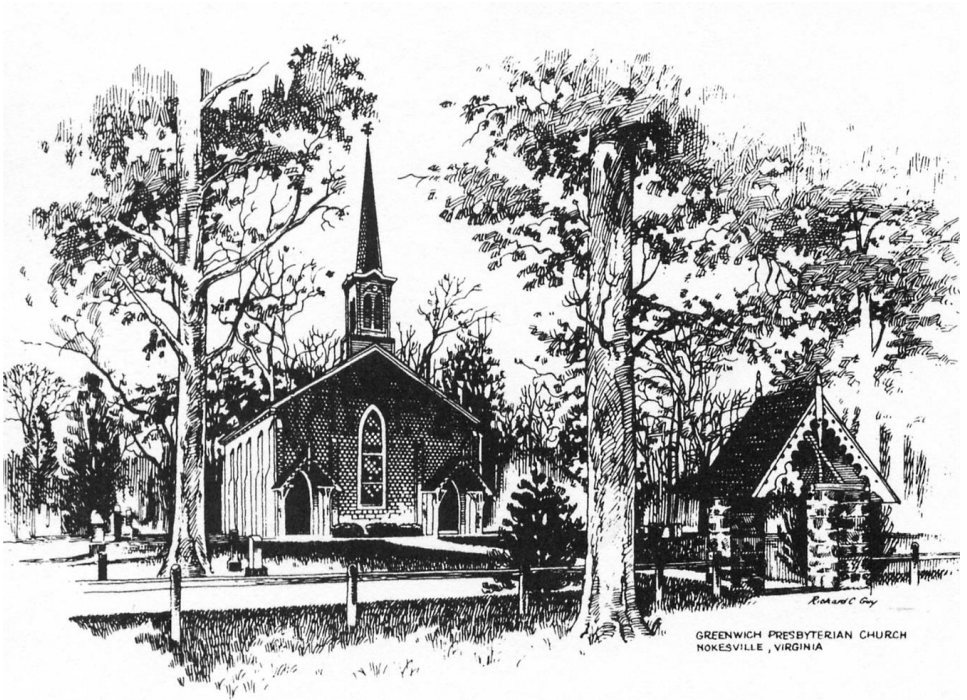

Health Tips

February was American Heart Health Month with a particular focus on Women's Heart Health.

Did You Know in the United States that:

- Leading cause of a woman's death is Heart Disease
- Every 90 seconds a woman suffers a heart attack

Major signs and symptoms of a heart attack:

- Chest pain or discomfort; unusually heavy pressure on the chest (some will describe like an elephant sitting on their chest)
- Sharp upper body pain- neck, back, and/or jaw
- Shortness of breath with or without chest pain/discomfort
- Unusual fatigue/tiredness, dizziness, light headedness
- Nausea or vomiting
- Experience cold sweat (not related to menopause)

Steps to take if you suspect someone is experiencing any of the above signs/symptoms

- **CALL 9-1-1 IMMEDIATELY**
- Seeking help immediately (within an hour of initial pain) allows medical treatments that prevent permanent damage to the heart muscle.

Risk Factors and prevention tips to be heart healthy:

- Diabetes- Know your blood sugar levels and take life style changes to prevent elevated blood sugar levels
- Diet high in unhealthy saturated fats/cholesterol- Add vegetables, fruits, fish, and fiber to your diet
- Excessive alcohol use-reduce amount
- High Blood pressure (major risk factor for heart attacks, strokes, and heart failure)-exercise, salt reduction, weight reduction,

- Obesity (increases risk of heart attacks, heart failure, and diabetes) –exercise and portion control
- Tobacco use-Smoking damages your lungs and your heart. Once you quit smoking your risk of having heart attacks reduces.
- Physical inactivity- exercise, increase social activities, take an extra lap around the grocery store, make activity FUN
