Congregational Survey

Our parent denomination, the Presbyterian Church (USA), continues to express beliefs, priorities, and practices that leave the Session (Elders and Pastors) feeling like Greenwich doesn't fit anymore. Last October the Session met with our local denominational leader, Rev. John Molina-Moore, to discuss these concerns in an open and respectful way. John suggested we conduct a survey to see how widely the congregation shares the Session's concerns. A small team of Elders, supported by our Pastors, has developed a simple survey that will enable you to provide feedback to the Session as we consider how best to lead Greenwich into the future.

To make the process as accessible as possible, we offer you three options for completing the survey:

- 1. Complete and return by mail in the envelope provided, or in person to the church office or the box in the Sanctuary lobby.

- 3. Pick up a survey in the lobby of the Sanctuary and return it to the box provided there.
