Juan & Veronica Linero

The Linero family are long-time mission partners of Greenwich, serving as missionary-pastors at Iglesia Una Luz En El Camino (A Light On the Path) in Tamaulipas, Mexico. We first met and developed a strong partnership with the Linero's through multiple mission projects in the 2000's. The border crisis in recent years has prevented our teams from traveling to Mexico, but the Linero's have adapted their work to care for the community and those most in need in the Matamoros area. From their recent mission report: "We have also gone to the hospital ministry...usually we do it once a month but God has provided to go every week using people who support us to buy the bread rolls to make the chicken and bean sandwiches, the coffee." Through this hospital ministry and other outreach programs, their church shares the gospel with their neighbors. They have also recently established a retirement home for older residents who have lost their homes and don't have the support they need. They ask for prayers, "That God continue using our lives for his service, for Priscilla in the hospital (their daughter is a physician), for residents at Jireh Retirement Home, and for the Church that people would come and hear from God."
